The retreat program: This is a special "time of the Lord," as that is what the word "Kairos" means in this context. It is a Christian experience of prayer and reflection, run by a team of adults and students. Students from other faith traditions are welcome and will be accommodated. Student responsibility and commitment are essential to the effectiveness of the retreat. For many students, this retreat will be a highlight of their time at St Paul's. Further information will be forwarded to parents and students closer to the retreat date.

Kairos is not an overnight retreat. A bus will transport students from the school at the beginning of the retreat, as well as back to the school at the end of the retreat where they will be dismissed as usual. However, as a general rule, students are expected to be dropped off in the morning and picked up in the evening. Students are not permitted to drive themselves to and from the retreat centre. Carpooling can be arranged directly by students/families. More information on the schedule will be sent out through e-mail.

Cost: Because of the length of the program and the planned activities, it is necessary to ask for a fee of \$250.00 to help cover the costs (the real cost surpasses \$400 per person). However, no student will be turned away because of money. See either the President, Mr. Lewin, or Mr. Martinez, the Campus Minister, if the cost is an issue. We do have funds available to make the retreat a possibility for everyone. No student will be turned away because he cannot afford to pay. Tax receipts will be issued for amounts beyond the minimum (\$250) contribution. If you are able, please consider making a donation that will make the retreat accessible to other students.

This form should be returned to the front desk/reception at the school. Priority will be given on a first-come, first-served basis. If you have any questions, please contact Mr. Martinez directly. There may be a waiting list for each of the retreats, so please let us know as soon as possible if your plans change and you are unable to participate during your requested date. Please consider other co-curricular commitments, which may lead to scheduling conflicts with some retreats, and ask if you are unsure.

The full amount of \$250 (in cash or cheque made out to "St Paul's High School") will be requested upon acceptance into the retreat.
